Cinema St. Louis – in partnership with Old North St. Louis Restoration Group – presents the Old North St. Louis Screening Series, a free monthly program for neighborhood residents and interested members of the larger St. Louis community.

The August offering is a screening of the award-winning film “HomeGrown.” The film plays at **7:30 p.m. Friday, August 27**, at the ONSLRG Gallery, 2700 N. 14th St. Following the film will be a discussion with Old North’s own Veronica Holden, Project Coordinator for the North City Farmers’ Market & 13th St. Garden Coordinator; James Anderson of Gateway Greening; & Jennifer Strayhorn of HopeBuild.

“HomeGrown ” documents the remarkable Dervaes family – father, son and two daughters – who run a small organic farm in the heart of urban Pasadena, Calif., creating a tiny rural island in the city’s vast sea. Living off the grid, they harvest more than 6,000 pounds of produce on less than a quarter-acre of land, make their own biodiesel, power their computers with the help of solar panels, and maintain a Web site that gets 4,000 hits a day. The film offers an intimate portrait of urban pioneers living a “Little House on the Prairie” existence in the 21st century.
